**MEMBER SERVICES TARIFF**

**KEY TELEPHONE SYSTEM**

**I. DESCRIPTION AND REGULATIONS**

Effective January 1, 1983, or the approval date of this tariff, the Key Equipment and Rates listed in this Section are available on a limited basis to new or existing, customers, and may be furnished, changed or additions made thereto, only as long as they can be properly maintained and/or provided from existing stock.

A. Key Telephone Systems provide an arrangement consisting of common equipment, key telephone sets, or telephone sets with externally mounted keys, with access to more than one central office trunk, PBX station line, or special service access line.

B. Key Telephone Systems are available only in connection with individual line, PBX systems, and private line service.

C. All telephones, (except private line telephones) associated with Key Telephone Systems must be located on the same premises within the same building. The Cooperative does not obligate itself to provide stations associated with key systems at off-premises locations where impairment of the service to the customer or the general public may be involved.

D. Where, in the opinion of the Cooperative, communications cannot be satisfactorily transmitted from or to any one station by using standard equipment and it is feasible to overcome the transmission difficulties by using special equipment, facilities, or arrangements, or when a customer desires features other than those regularly available, the service will be provided at additional rates or charges based on the circumstances in each individual case as provided in Section 6, Special Service Arrangements.

E. Key Telephone systems are subject to electrical and transmission limitations, therefore the Cooperative reserves the right to limit the number of stations in a system if it is necessary to prevent impairment of the service.

F. The power wiring, power outlet, and commercial power where required for operating the key telephone system and signaling equipment will be furnished by the customer, who also assumes all responsibility for the safe condition of such wiring, outlets and power.

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**I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION AND REGULATIONS (Continued)**

G. For the installation of recessed key units, the customer is required to provide an opening in the furniture or shelf of sufficient size to accommodate the key telephone system equipment.

H. Options or features are available only with the systems with which they are associated in this Tariff.

**II. KEY TELEPHONE EQUIPMENT AND FEATURES**

A. The following basic service features are normally available in the design of a key system:

1. Pick-up - By operating the keys of the telephone, the user can connect to or "Pickup" the different individual trunks or lines available at the key telephone instrument.

2. Hold - Allows the telephone user to put one trunk or line on "hold" and place or receive a call on one of the other individual trunks or lines available at the instrument. Hold condition is indicated by a visual winking hold light on the line held.

3. Key Illumination - Provides a visual indication at all stations of the system, to indicate to the other users the status of each line. The illumination can indicate either a line in use (steady light), a line on hold (fast flashing light), or a line receiving an incoming call (slow flashing light).

4. Signal - Audible or flashing visual signals are provided to announce an incoming or intercom call. The signals can be bells, buzzers, lights or any combination of these.

5. Intercommunication - The optional intercom feature allows one station user to call another station user by depressing the proper key of the instrument and dialing or signaling the desired party.

B. The basic key telephone instrument provided with a standard key telephone system is a six-button instrument or a separately mounted six-button unit equipped with the above listed features. Instruments with capacity for additional lines and features may be provided as required to meet customer's service requirements.

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**II. KEY TELEPHONE EQUIPMENT AND FEATURES (Continued)**

- C. The basic rates and charges specified for key telephone systems include a power supply, operated by commercial power, which is required for the operation of the various features.
- D. Audible signaling for key telephone systems may be provided by individual bell, common bells, or common buzzers. Such signals, not to exceed one individual bell per station. One common bell or common buzzer per station will be furnished without additional charge. Station signals will be limited to the number which will operate satisfactorily on a line.

**III. RATES AND CHARGES**

The following rates and charges are applicable in addition to access line rates for the class of service listed in Section 4, Local Exchange Rates.
